of Marche in the piers of the Daigne of same Sovereign Lord James by the grace of gods
King of England Scotland France and Ireland Defender of the faith or that is to
say of England France and Ireland the thirtieth and of Scotland the ninth and
fortieth. Anno Domini one thousand six hundred and sixteenth. In piers of the Daigne
and bequeatheth unto all my younger sonnes and to my three younger daughters
Elizabeth Anne and Katherine Wolsey all such plate and spoons be yt silver or
silver and gylte as I have of heretofore in my Custodie to them and every or any of them
by their good fathers or good mothers to be delivered unto them or by two of my
Executors within three monthes next after my Decease. I shall the residue of my
little plate as aforesayed of all sortes of gylte and bequeatheth the one half to my eldest
sonne Alexander and the other half to my three younger sonnes William Henry Roger
Thomas and James Wolsey equally by my Executors to be divided and delivered
unto them within three monthes next after my Decease. Item my will and
meaning is that the shalbe piers of the said land here adjoining unto the wallmutter
whereof I have a lease from Mr William Champion Esquire and from Mr
William the younger his sonne shall remaine and be to the use benefitt and profit of
him or them that shall from tyme to tyme as I have appoynted well and lawfully
in the said wallmutter house. And also when once my sayed sonne Alexander shalbe
performed in convenient tyme all and every the Articles by and betwene him and
me agreed upon under our handes and sealed bearing date the eighteenth daye
of April Anno Dni one thousand six hundred and fiftene my will and meaning
is that he shall have all such householdes as are at the tyme of my Decease in any my
householdes or in any other place or roode as for that purpose. And also he likewise
at the tyme aforesayed to have delivered to him and to his use all such gamut beames
gamut staves armes bellone borders and other such like Tooles for the use of the farge
as are or shalbe at the tyme of my Decease. And as touching that for that purpose. I
item I give and bequeatheth to my three younger daughters Elizabeth Anne and
Katherine Wolsey all such bookes as were heretofore their mothers and also all
those paper bookes and naates of what sort so ever they be of such like of which the
most part are or be to be found in the Chamber where I do lye and in those closets witten
the same Chamber. All which bookes and naates or to be equalled distributed and
delivered twixt the three daughters aforesayed by my Executors or two of them
within three monthes next after my Decease. Item I give and bequeatheth unto my
youngest daughter Katherine Wolsey tenne poundes more of lawfull money of
England then I gave already given her by my last will and testament first aforesayed
in respect that until she be of the age of eighteenth yeres she is not to have so much for
her perche mayntenance as her two elder Sisters Elizabeth and Anne Wolsey. And
tenne poundes I will and assigne my Executors or one of them or their assignes to
pay my sayed daughter quarterly upon each quarter daye next after my Decease
until tenne poundes be payed.
