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



god for the same and considering the shortness of my life the certainty of my death  
and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle that estate  
before this earthly tabernacle of mine be dissolved that God in mercy hath  
bestowed on me doth will and ordain this my last will and testamēt in a  
maner and forme following that is to say first and principally commanding  
my soul to God who gave it and as for my body I command it to the  
earth from whence it was taken to be decently buried in such Christian like  
maner as my benefactors hereafter named shall think fitt my funeral expenses  
expences not to exceed the charges hereafter by me appointed Item I give  
will and devise unto my Neffew Mr Thomas Culpeper of Glyndford in the  
County of Selsby & Borreton and to his heires and assignes for ever all that my  
Widewage entitulat farme and landes with their and every of their appertaining  
to the said mesnage belonging commonly called Goostoe or by what other  
name or names soever the same are or is called or knowne situate lying and  
being in Eastmalling in the said County of Selsby containing in the whole by  
estimation sixty acres bee the same more or lesse now in the occupation of  
Edward Statfield his assynd or assyndes and albot all that my widowage  
or entitulat farme and divers parts or parcels of land with their and every  
of their appertaininges unto the said farme belonging situate lying and being  
in Cobham in the said County of Selsby containing by estimation fifty acres  
bee the same more or lesse and now in the occupation of John Daceys his  
assynd or assyndes and albot all those my two mesnages or tenements with  
the gards and other the appertaininges therunto belonging situate lying and a  
being neare the Little Didge in Maidstone in the County of Kent aforesaid  
now in the occupation of Jane Whittingbrook widow her assynd undertenant  
or undertenant and albot all that my widowage of yearly rent charge of thirtie  
thre shillings and four pence per annum issuing out of certaine lands lying and  
being in Dorey in the said County of Kent and granted by John Fisher unto  
Mr John Culpeper the fathir and John Culpeper the sonne the churchedd of St.  
William Culpeper deceased late father of me the said Mary Culpeper to have  
and to hold all and singular the said mesnages or tenements lands widowage  
and premises with all and singular their and every of their appertaininges unto  
my said neffew Mr Thomas Culpeper and to his heires and assignes for ever to the

only next intent and purpost that my said Neophyte Thomas Culpeper shalbe  
 enabled (by the devisor aforesaid) to pay my severall legary and legacies by this my  
 will herein after given to the severall and respectif person and persons herein after  
 named and likewise to bee thereby enabled to pay all my debts in what kind nature  
 or degree soever that I shall owe to any person or persons whatsoever at the time of  
 my death especially such monys as I shall owe to H<sup>r</sup> 2<sup>d</sup> id out my physician who hath so  
 long tyme tane to keepe my health for his seruices and paines herein and further  
 to enable my said Neophyte to diotharge my funerall expences item it is my will and  
 mind and I do hereby declare that all and singular myward Messenges to me in  
 farme land & Cluny and pretuised with thappertuaned before herein given to  
 my said Neophyte Thomas Culpeper and his heires shall imediately (after my death)  
 stand charged and chargable with the payement of my severall debts funerall expences  
 and my severall legacies herein after given to the severall and respectif person and  
 persons herein after named and according to the devisor and severall devise herein  
 after summed intimated expressed and declared to bee issuing and payable out of  
 the same according to the true intent and meaning of this my testamēt and last  
 will that is to say Item I give and bequeath unto my dear and loving sister Olitia  
 Culpeper now wifte and lady of S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Culpeper of Dallingberet in the  
 said County of Kent al<sup>t</sup> the summe of two hundred pounds of lawfull mony of  
 England to bee paid to her the said Olitia Culpeper by my said Neophyte Thomas  
 Culpeper of Cylefford out of my said messenges land & tenementes Cluny  
 and pretuised before herein summed intimated declared to the said S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Culpeper  
 my Neophyte and his heires within six monthes next after my decease Item I give  
 and bequeath unto my dear and loving sister ffrauncis Porter wifte of Thomas  
 Porter of Denshurst in the parish of Denshurst in the said County of Sussex Geue the  
 like summe of two hundred pounds of lawfull mony of England to bee paid to my said  
 sister ffrauncis Porter by my said Neophyte S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Culpeper out of my said  
 messenges farme land & Cluny and pretuised before herein summed intimated  
 to my said Neophyte and his heires within six monthes next after my decease Item  
 I give unto my kyn and loving maid and servant (whiche now lieth with me) Susanna  
 Dorell the summe of one hundred pounds of lawfull mony of England to bee paid  
 to my said servant maid Susanna Dorell by my said Neophyte S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Culpeper  
 out of my said messenges land & tenementes Cluny and pretuised before herein  
 summed intimated to my said Neophyte and his heires within six monthes next  
 after my decease Item I give and bequeath unto my said brother Thomas Porter the said  
 the summe of twenty shillings of lawfull mony of England and to the parish of  
 Cylefford the summe of ten pounds of like lawfull mony of England and albow I  
 give and bequeath unto John Chaunter of Mayfield the summe of forty shillings of  
 like lawfull mony of England to bee paid to my said brother Thomas Porter the said  
 parish of Cylefford and the said John Chaunter by my said Neophyte S<sup>r</sup> Thomas  
 Culpeper within six monthes next after my decease as aforesaid Item all my goods  
 Chattels and personall estate whatevēr I give and bequeath unto my said two sisters  
 Olitia Culpeper and ffrauncis Porter equally (as possible) to bee divided between them  
 without I make any ordaine to my Executriores of this my last will and testamēt and  
 my will and mind is that my said Executriores shall bury me and godre the decency  
 of my funerall and that my said Neophyte S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Culpeper shall pay unto my  
 said Executriores all such monys as they shall lay out in burying of me (not exceeding  
 about fifty pounds) out of my said messenges farme land & tenementes Cluny and  
 pretuised before by me given to him and his heires within six monthes next after  
 my decease and further my will and mind is and it is the true intent and meaning  
 of my said will that if my said Neophyte S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Culpeper his heires Executriores  
 or Administratores doctor shall after six monthes shalbe exempted from the tyme of

my debtors refus or neglect to pay-satisfie to me and discharge all and every my debt  
 and debto by me owing to any person or persons whatsoeuer at the time of my death or  
 the charge and expens of my funerall or deo or shall refus or neglect to pay (during the  
 space aforesaid) any of my legator or legaties or either of them by me before in this my  
 will given and bequeathed to the severall and respective person and persons before in this  
 my will bequeathed them I give will and deo all and singular my aforesaid mchaggs  
 or tractmto farmed and tenanted to Cluny hereditaments and premises  
 with their and every of their appurtenances unto my said two sisters and heires  
 Elizia Culpeper and frances Porter and to their heirs and assigns for ever and  
 also all other my mchaggs farmed lands tenanted to Cluny and premises  
 before in this my will given and derived unto my said Elizabth S<sup>t</sup> Thomas Culpeper  
 and his heirs to hold to my said Elizabth S<sup>t</sup> Thomas Culpeper and frances Porter  
 their heirs and assigns for ever to the intent that they my said Elizabth S<sup>t</sup> Thomas  
 and the survivor of them and the heirs of the survivor of them shall and will within  
 five moneths next after such refusal grant sell and dispose of the same to any person  
 or persons whatsoeuer and his her and their heirs att and for the best rate and  
 price they may or can gett for the same and the money arising by the sale of my  
 said mchaggs or tenements farmed lands Cluny and premises I will my  
 said Elizabth S<sup>t</sup> Thomas shall pay all and every my debt and debto legato and funerall  
 executed to the severall person and persons by me owing att the time of my  
 death and the legato by me before given in such manner and forme and to  
 such person and persons as I have before in this my will nominated limited  
 and appointed to the severall person and persons in this my will named according  
 to the intent and true meaning of this my will and the oversplus of the money after  
 the payment of my debts legato and funerall executors I give and bequeath unto  
 my said Elizabth S<sup>t</sup> Thomas and his heirs equally to be divided betwix them and my further will and  
 mind is that my said Elizabth S<sup>t</sup> Thomas Culpeper shall not have then any benefitt  
 or advantag by this my will and that also that the deo by me made aforesaid  
 in this my will of my mchaggs lands tenanted to Cluny and premises to my  
 said Elizabth S<sup>t</sup> Thomas Culpeper and his heirs shall absolutely void in law soe  
 that he may not reapt any benefitt thereby by making such refusal as is before  
 mentioned and I doe desir my loving brother S<sup>t</sup> Thomas Culpeper of Wellingbourn  
 and Thomas Porter to bee executors of this my will to the intent that they should  
 set it duly performed according to the tenent and meaning therof and I doe  
 revoke all former wills by me made and declare this to be my last in testimony  
 whereof to this my last will and testament being written in my shet of paper  
 I the said Mary Culpeper to every and each sheet therof have subscribed my  
 name and to the last sheet thereof have sett my seal this tenth day of June in the  
 year of our Lord one thousand six hundred eighty four Olmoq Regis Car  
 3d Circonsu statu Mary Culpeper sealed published and declared by the said  
 Mary Culpeper as her last will and testament after these words were interlined  
 (my) (as aforesaid) (unto my) (the) (her) (to be) (whileng) then such refusal had  
 to such person and persons in the presence of no: John Barnard Tho: Porter June  
 Arthur Dott Jr.

The seven and twentieth day of December anno in our thousand six hundred eighty  
four and in the six and thirtieth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles the  
Second by the grace of God of England Scotland France and Ireland King Defender of  
the faith & Anthony Cooper of the Town of Leicester in the County of Leicestershire  
Carrying sick in body but of sound and perfect memory prayed before Almighty  
God for the saint and considering the uncertainty of this transitory life and that all  
flesh must yield unto death when it shall please God to call me hence and ordain this  
my last will and testament in manner and forme following first and principally I  
committ my soule to God my Creator absitely trusting that by the intercession of my  
Saviour Iesu Christ he will pardon and forgive me all my sinnes and my body to  
committ to the earth wherof it is made in hope of a joyfull resurrection at the latter  
day and to be remitted to my soul and together with it possess and enjoy everlast-  
ing life among the saints of God in Heaven and for such worldly wealth as it hath  
pleased Almighty God far about my dooing to bestowe on me I give and dispose  
hereof as followeth Imp. I will that all that Merchandise or tenement with the appur-  
tenances now in my owne possession situated and being in Laurencehill street in the  
Town of Leicester aforesaid shall after my death go unto the heirs of my Mother  
Oliver Cooper deceased according to the last will and testament of my father Anthony  
Cooper Item I will that all my other merchandise or tenement with the appurtenances  
situated in the high street in the town of Leicester aforesaid and now in the occupation  
of John Coates Baker and allore all my Wares Cattle Materials and goods what-  
soeuer (except plate) shall (after my debts) be sold by my loving brother in law  
Benjamin Thody of the parish of St. Martin in the fields in the County of Middle  
Coath-maker and the money raised by sale thereof together with all such monies a  
Credito and other estate whatsoever that I shall dye possessed of or which shall in  
any manner of wise be due owing or belonging unto me at the time of my decease  
Item the Merchandise or tenement first above mentioned and plate aforesaid shall  
(after my debts and expenses paid and funeral expences discharged) be divided into  
three equal parts one equal part whereof I will that the said Benjamin Thody from  
time to time as occasion shall require do lay out upon his wife for my father in law  
James Cooper in such manner and by such portions as her the said Benjamin Thody shall  
think fit and a second equal part thereof I will that her pay unto my sister in law Ann  
Cottfield wife of John Cottfield of the said parish of St. Martin in the fields Eallow  
Chandler but in case the said Oliver shall happen to dye before the same be paid her then  
I bequeath her said equal part to her two daughters and the Children Children now in the  
Womb of her the said Oliver equally to be divided amongst them and to be paid unto them  
when they shall accomplish their severall ages of one and twenty years or be married  
whiche of them shall first happen and if it fortuneth any of the said Children to deesse  
before they come to their said ages and before that time bee not married that then I  
bequeath the part or share of her or him so decessing to the survivor or survivor of them  
to be paid them when they shall accomplish their said ages or else bee divided amongst  
and allore if the said James Cooper happen to dye before his said equal part bee laid out  
upon him as is above mentioned then I bequeath the same or so much therof as shall  
bee remaining and not laid out unto the daughters of the said Oliver Cottfield and Child  
or Children now in her Womb equally to be divided amongst them and to be paid to  
them at their ages or times of marriage as aforesaid and in case of death to the survivors  
of them as aforesaid and the third equal part of my said estate I will that the said Benjamin
