 que of our lord god a thousand fyne hundred myghtie fyne and in the seven and thirtieth yere of the reygne of Edward the sixth
 Sadie Elizabeth or Richard ffayne of the parische of Carnton Bisshopp in the Countie of Devon Enbommed
 being in perfect health and in good remembrance god be thanked) Do make and ordayne this my present
 Testament declaringe herein my last will in manner and forme following. First I commend my soule into
 the handes of my lord god Almightye and my bodie to the christian Buriall. Next I give to the poore people
 of the parische of Carnton Bisshopp to be distributed after my decease by my exors for ever after named
 three shillinges for ever yere. Also I give and bequeathe to Thomas ffayne sixe poundeb yf he cannot
 take the living but yf he can take the livinge then he shall have nothing. Also I give and bequeathe to
 my sonne Nicholas ffayne sixe poundeb. Also I give and bequeathe to my sonne William ffayne sixe
 poundeb to be payed to either of them when they shall accomplish the age of thre and twenty yeres. And
 yf any of the said brother happen to dye before they shall accomplish the foresayed age, Then the sayd
 money to remaine amongst the brother or brotheres that are living. Also I give and bequeathe to my
 Daughten Emme ffayne sixe poundeb. Also I give and bequeathe unto my daughten Johane ffayne
 eighte poundeb. Also I give and bequeathe unto my daughten Agnes ffayne twentie nobles. Also I
 give and bequeathe unto my Daughten Mary ffayne eighte poundeb every severall somme and sommes
 to be payed to either of the sayd Sisters at their or either of their marriages. And also yf any of
 the said sisters happen to dye before they shall be married Then every of the said severall somme and
 sommes shall remaine amongst the rest of the said Sisters that are living. Also I give and bequeathe
 unto my sister Richard one ewe and lambe. Also I give and bequeathe unto my Daughten Margery
 Walter one ewe and lambe. Also I give and bequeathe unto my godchildren for ever yere a pce.
 And also I give and bequeathe unto my godsonne one Maie pce and no for ever yere. Also I
 give and bequeathe unto Richard Colcott one pce yf he staye with his Dame out six yere he shall
 have one ewe lambe more. The rest of all my goodes and chattell not given nor bequeathed my
 depts and legacies payed and discharged and my bodie to be brought in earth I do give
 them unto my wife Agnes ffayne and her I make my whole executrix. Provided allwayes and
 my will yf that all the goodes and chattell sixty fore given and bequeathed to be payed to my
 parturien pson when they shall accomplish the tyme aforesayed. And also I do make my overseers
 of this my last will Thomas Rawle John Thorne thelder and Brian Westcott to see my will performed
 And for thure payed I give them thre shillinges a pce. witnesses James Thorne Philip Walter
 and George Rawle

Thomas Bourde of Andfeld and my cosyn Thomas Sulpepper of Baltham be overseers of this my last
will and give them twenty fulling a peere for thair paymes hoping that they will helpe and ayde my
