 whom he then lawfully married and made to be sole and whole executrix of this his last will

 daughter the sume of fourie poundes of Lawfull Englishe money Item I doe give and bequeathe
 to Iem Morice my sonne the like sume of fourie poundes of like Englishe money whiche said
 several sumes I will to be satisfied and paid by Thomas Morice myne eldest sonne and
