Tenth day of October in the second year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles the Second by the Grace of God of England Scotland France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith etc. in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred sixty and eight I Dame Isobel Goldespere of Clyfford in the County of Kent widow being of sound and perfect memory desiring to settle my estate in such good order that after my decease there may be no question or controversy therein do hereby make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following first giving my soul into the hands of God my Creator to Jesus Christ my Redeemer and to his holy Ghost my Comforter not doubting to be numbered amongst the elect Saints of God by and through the only merits death and meritorious sacrifice of my only Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ And I appoint my body to be buried in the Church of the parish Church of Clyfford aforesaid as near as to the grave of Sir William Goldespere Barronet my late deceased husband as with convenience may be done And as touching the goods and personall estate which my Gracious God of his boundless goodness hath liberally bestowed on me I will and bequeath in manner and form following first I give and bequeath unto the Poor people of the parish of Clyfford forty Shillings to be distributed amongst them at my funeral by my executor hereinafter named Also I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Dame Marie Goldespere the now wife of Sir Thomas Goldespere Knight the sum of Ten pounds to be paid unto her within one year next after my decease Also I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Frances Almon the now wife of John Almon the younger Esquire the like sum of Ten pounds to be likewise paid unto her within one year next after my decease Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Goldespere the like sum of Ten pounds to be paid unto her within one year after my decease Also I give and bequeath unto John Wyney of Chiddinstone in the said County Gent five pounds to be paid unto him within one year next after my decease Also I give and bequeath unto Thomas Hurner of East Malling in the said County Gent the like sum of five pounds to be paid unto him within one year next after my decease and I give and bequeath unto Edward Barrington of Chiddinstone aforesaid Gent the sum of five pounds to be paid unto him within one year next after my decease This is the last will and testament of me the said Dame Isobel Goldespere for and touching my manners lands and Tenements wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me first I give and bequeath unto my Grandchild Sir Thomas Goldespere Barronet the sum of my late Son Sir Richard Goldespere Barronet deceased all that my part or partell of Chables and Woodlands called Tarrys dell also with the apurtenances lying and being in Ditch in the said County and more largely purtraced of Thomas Tomlin of East Malling aforesaid yeoman deceased also I give and bequeath unto my said Grandchild Sir Thomas Goldespere Barronet all that my manor of Blithenden with the rights members and apurtenances thereto belonging together with all courts purquises and profits of Courts routes Quittrents Duties Services fines Chimeriamours bovyalls Reliefs of the said manors offices foliows goods and all other franchises privileges and royalties whatsoever to the said manor belonging And also all that mansion and manor house of Blithenden aforesaid in the parish of Sedorne in the said County of Kent And all the lands and Tenements whatsoever with the apurtenances to the said mansion and manor house belonging or therewith used occupied or enjoyed lying and being in Sedorne aforesaid and now in

the tenure of Richard Waterman or of his assigne or assignes. And all that my
messuages and farms with all the lands arable meadows pasture and woodland
and all other appurtenances whatsoever hereto belonging situate lying and
being in Deddorn aforesaid late in the tenure of Thomas Mylsted or of his assigne
or assignes and now in the tenure of me the said Dame Hilene Goldespere and
also all that my messuages and farms with all the lands Tenements hereditaments
and appurtenances situate lying and being in Deddorn aforesaid now in the
Tenure of John Dalby or of his assigne or assignes. And also all other
my messuages lands Tenements and hereditaments with their appurtenances
situate lying and being in Deddorn aforesaid and also all those my
messuages lands Tenements and hereditaments with their appurtenances
situate lying and being in Marden in the County aforesaid and now or late
in the several tenures or occupations of Francis Goddin, John Chyngam

and to be begotten for ever. And for want of such issue to the use
and behoofe of the right heirs of me the said Dame Hilene Goldespere
for ever. And to and for no other use or use behoofe intent or purpose
whatsoever. And I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary
Goldespere all that my messuages and lands called Gosse with all and
singular the appurtenances thereto belonging situate lying and
being in the parish of East Malling aforesaid now in the tenure or
occupation of Edward Sticklefield or of his assigne or assignes undertenant
or under tenants. And all that my messuages lands Tenements
hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever situate lying and
being in the parish of Cobham in the said County and now or late in
the tenure or occupation of William Haye or of his assigne or assignes
undertenant or under tenants. And also all those my two messuages
or Tenements with their appurtenances situate lying and being
in Maidstone in the said County next unto a Bridge there called
the little Bridge now or late in the tenure or occupation of Nath-
anil Penerton or of his assigne or assignes undertenant or under tenants.
And also one Chantry or yearly rent of thirty three shillings and
four pence which I now have issuing out of certain lands lying
in Berley in the said County heretofore the inheritance of John
Brewer Gent and granted by John Wynter unto John Goldespere
the father and John Goldespere the son Cluefford of the said
Sir William Goldespere the late deceased husband of me the said
Dame Hilene Goldespere and by him given to me the said Dame
Hilene by his last will and Testament. Do have and to hold all
and singular the said several messuages lands Tenements

 sole Exorutor of this my last will and Testament And I doe make Dame
 Margaret Wolpewir widow the mother of my said Grandchild & Thomas
 Overseer of the same Trusting and desiring her to assist my said Exorutor
 in the proving of this my will and in the managing of the estate therein I
 have heroby given And soe Revoking all former wills by me made I doe
 publish and declare this present writing to be my last will and Testament
 And in Testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seale the day and
 year first above written Helen Wolpewir signed sealed & published
 and declared by the above named Dame Helen Wolpewir to be her last
 will and Testament in the presence of us Dow Barrington William Clutter

 lastly I leave my loving friends Thomas Allom and William Nicholas Overseers
 of this my will to care of whom I give the summe of Twenty Shillings hoping
